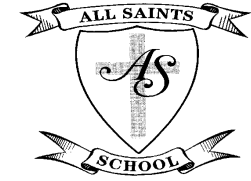




**All Saints RC Primary School  
PUPIL PREMIUM PLAN for  
2017-2018**



The Pupil Premium is additional finance given to publicly funded schools in England targeted specifically to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers.

**LEVEL OF FUNDING**

Pupil premium funding is paid to schools according to the number of pupils who have:

- been registered as eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years
- a parent in the Armed Forces
- been looked after for one day or more, are adopted, leave care under a special guardianship order or a residence order
- 3 and 4 year olds whose families meet eligibility criteria

In the financial year, schools received:

- £1320 for each eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years primary-aged pupil
- £1900 for each eligible looked-after pupil
- £300 for each eligible student with parents in the Armed Forces.
- £300 for each early years pupil whose families meet the eligibility criteria

**Total of children on roll September 2017: 85**

In 2017-18, we expect to receive £10,161. This funding is calculated using pupil data from the census in January 2017 when we had 2 pupils who received the Early Years Pupil Premium, 4 pupils who had received free school meals, 2 looked after or previously looked after pupils and 2 pupils whose parents were in the Forces.

At All Saints Primary School we use our allocated Pupil Premium budget and the overall School Budget Share to ensure that all teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of our pupils and that no pupil is disadvantaged. We give a great deal of consideration through assessment and pastoral care and support to identifying, supporting and tracking vulnerable pupils and groups.
